




Orchid Show at the Toledo Zoo.

For the price of admission (\$12-\$14), you can stroll through, AND photograph, the Orchid Show in the Museum of Natural History. The show is open 10am -4 pm, Friday, Saturday and Sunday starting February 10, with hundreds of orchids on display. The show is on two levels of the museum plus the greenhouse. Last year there was a room set up with black lights (UV light), with specific orchids, demonstrating how some insects and birds view the flower, in a light spectrum only visible to them.



Black and White Photography

Spencer Cox has a good article on black and white photography. Much of it builds on great practices in all photography emphasizing those elements that are especially important for Black and White and Monochrome photography. He advises taking B&W photos in color and then converting them. He emphasizes the value of using RAW rather than JPEG since RAW has more information and greater image quality. You also don't lose flexibility when using RAW.

He then lays out the important elements for Black and White Photography:

- Shadow
- Contrast
- Tones
- Shapes
- Texture
- Composition
- Emotion

Shadow is a major element of composition and is sometimes the subject of your picture. Shadows without details leave one with a feeling of emptiness while when subtle and detailed it leads to a more complex picture.

Contrast is the brightest and darkest containing both black and white. A photo with high contrast emphasizes a sense of intensity.

Tones, both dark and light, can tell a story. Silvery midtones work well when your picture calls for subtlety.

Shapes are the basis of all photography but when you remove color they are even more important.

Texture fills in the rest of the pictures complementing the shapes.

Composition is the area that tells your audience that you purposely captured the picture in a particular way. It's more than a snapshot.

The conveyance of emotion is the most important part. The rest of the elements serve emotion. It is directly related to the mood and message of your photos.



Following is a direct quote from the article because his directions are very clear:

6.1. How to Make an Image Black & White in Lightroom

There are a few ways to convert photos to black and white in Lightroom but the easiest is just to toggle “Black & White” treatment at the very top of the basic panel or just press “v” on your keyboard.

You can also convert a photo to black and white by reducing the saturation to –100 , or (with some cameras) by changing the profile under “Camera Calibration” to monochrome. But these methods are not optimal, since they eliminate some options under the HSL tab to adjust individual colors in the black and white mix.



Although the HSL tab is very valuable for fine-tuning black and white photos , be aware that extreme adjustments frequently add high levels of noise to your image. This can be minimized somewhat in the noise reduction panel (specifically the “color noise” reduction), but it is best to just




